Hill Center

Hill is an extension of the Lansing School District high schools- Eastern, Everett, and J.W. Sexton, the adult program, and local parochial schools. Regardless of age or home school, students attend the career- technical classes at Hill to gain employment skills. While many students are ready to go into the work force directly upon completion of their Hill programs, many others continue on with their education, either at the community college or four year college level.

Hill offers many new experiences for interested students: career-technical clubs and competition related to the programs and the Student Activities Committee. Additionally, students often interact with the public in the course of mastering their

programs' skills: cosmetology, food management, health services, building management and repair- to name a few.

Job placement services are provided for students at Hill on a more concentrated level than at the home schools because students at Hill are training for employment. Several job programs help assure that students who apply for this assistance are usually successful in their job search.

Counseling and career assessment services are also available. Testing and evaluation, that is quite costly, is free at Hill.

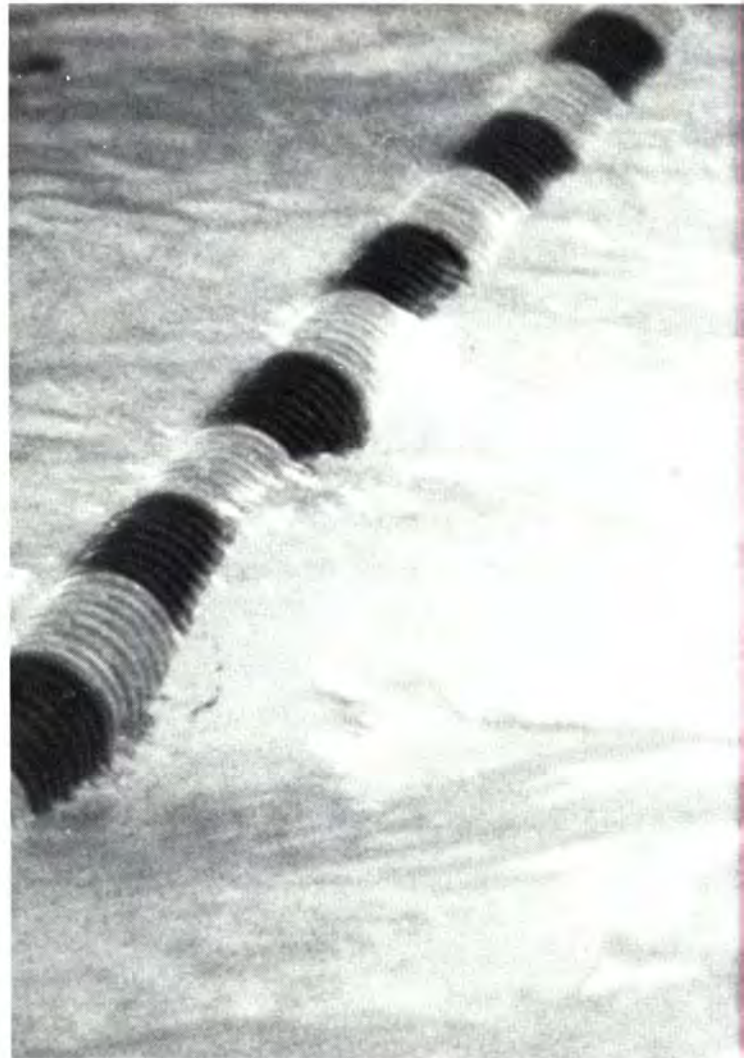

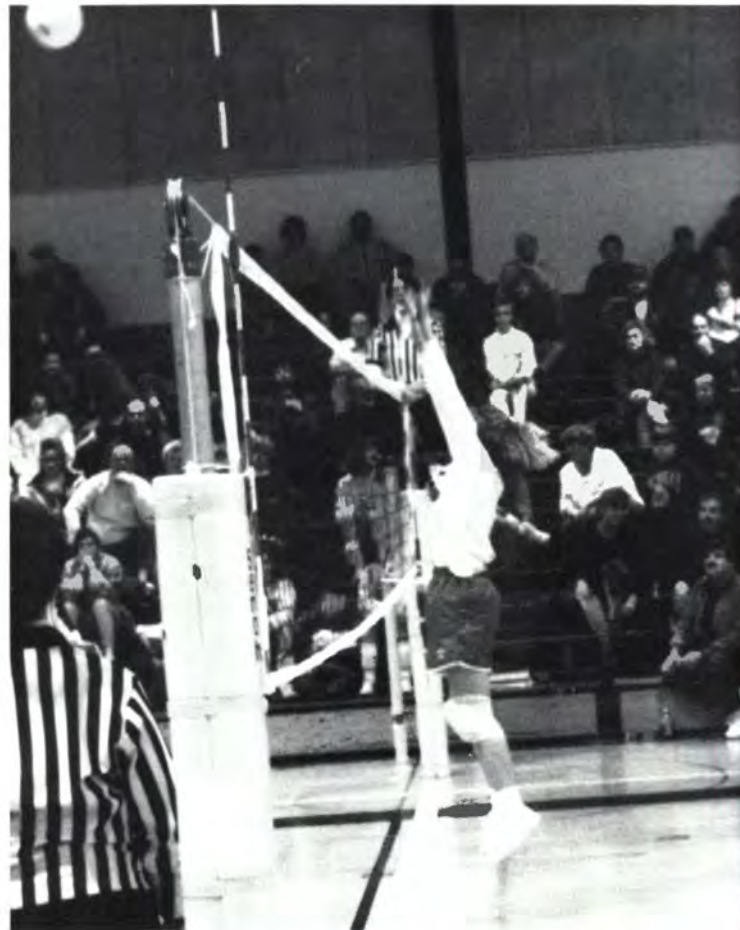

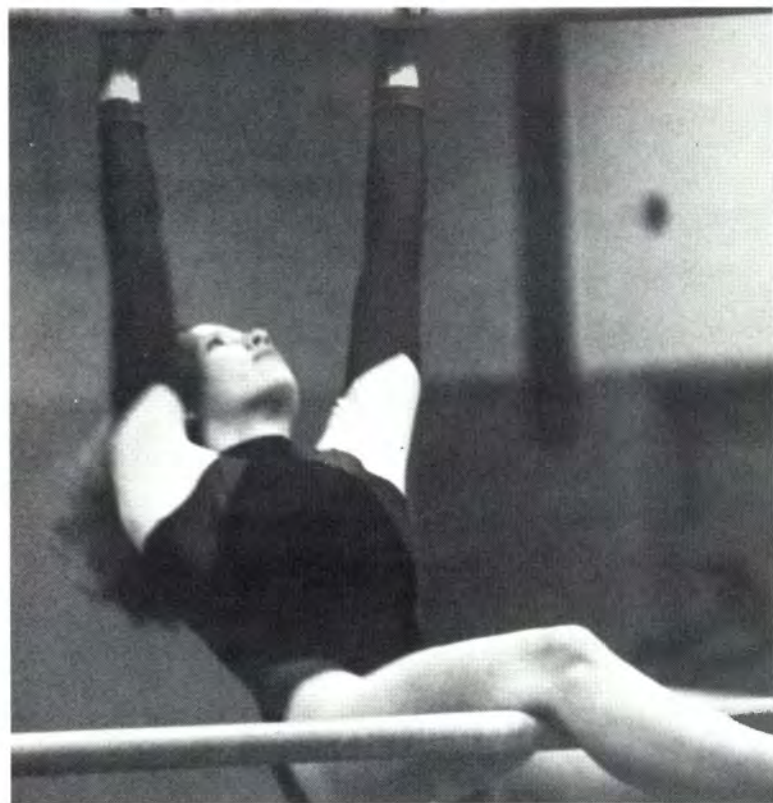

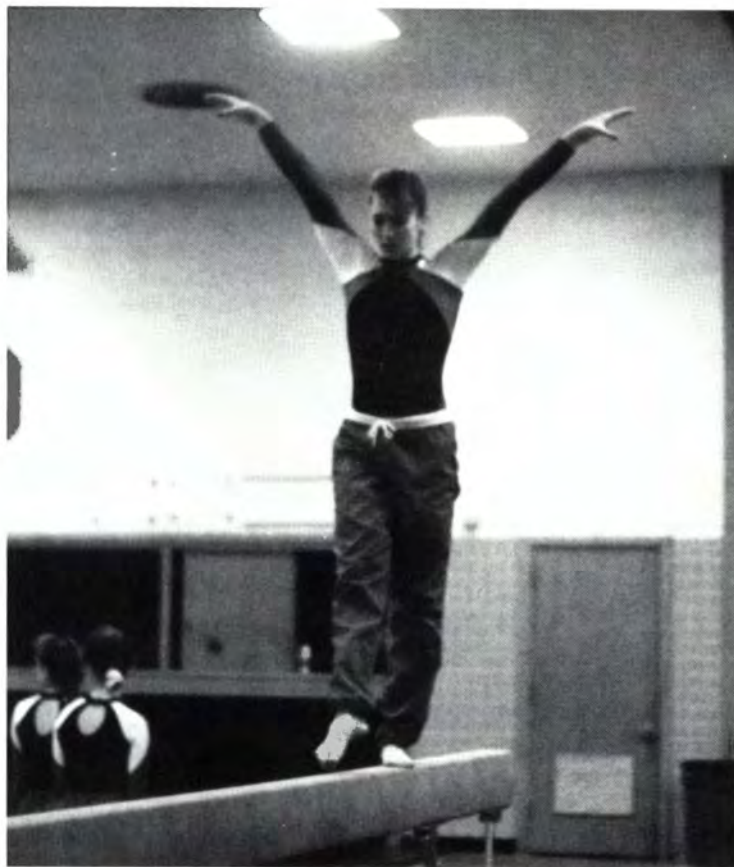
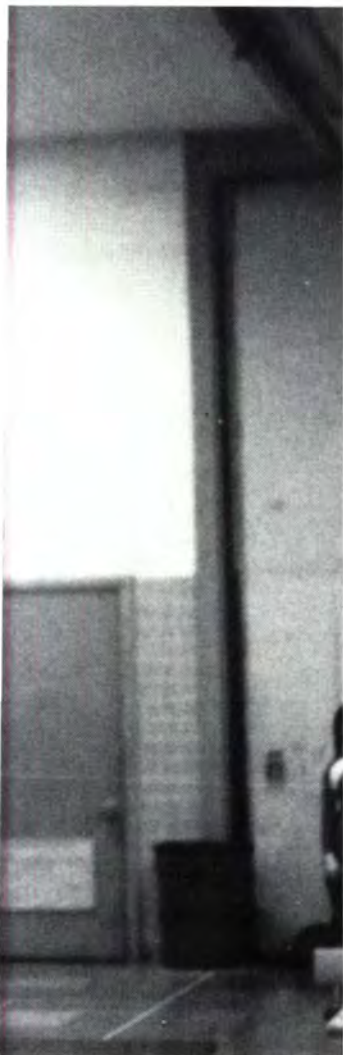

Wes Biles led the team at first singles, giving the Big Reds the leadership they so desperately

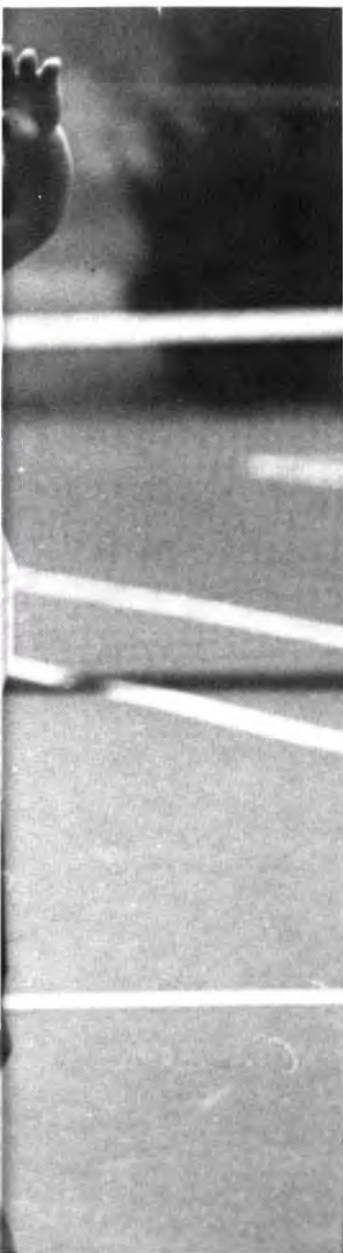

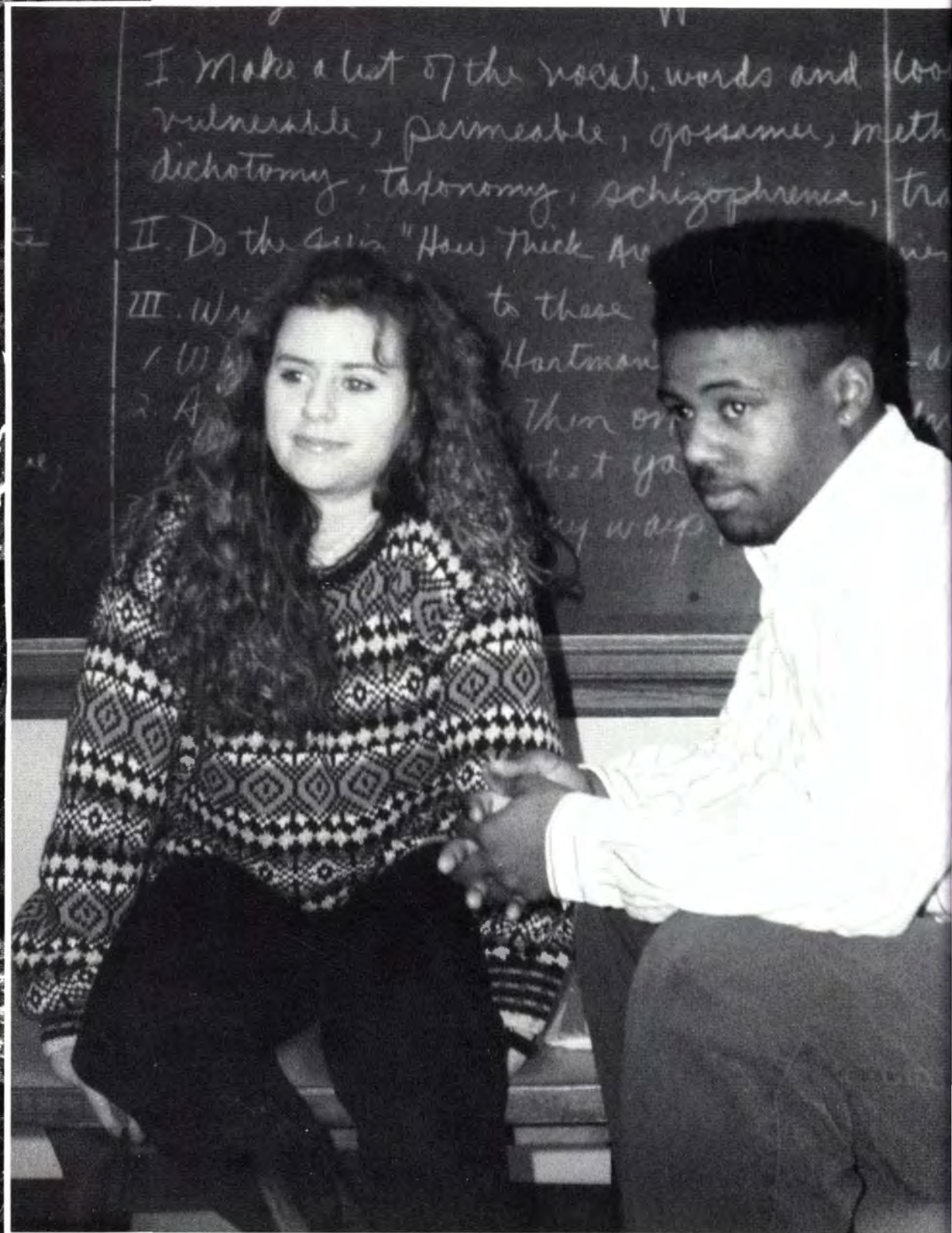

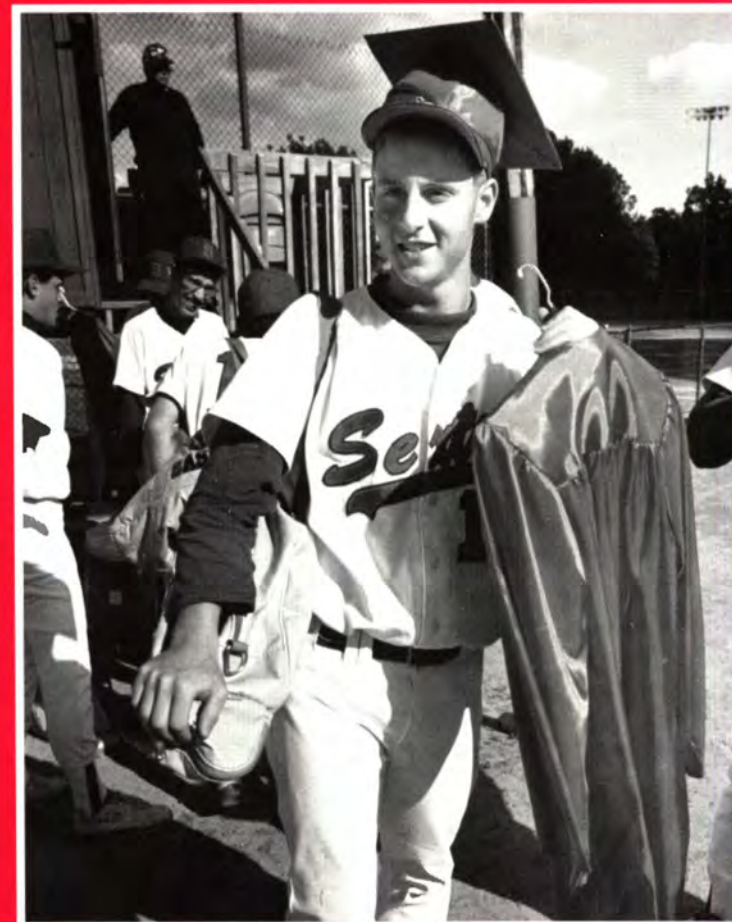

Kristi Yamaguchi, figure skating

You'd never guess that Kristi Yamaguchi was born with foot problems. Last year the twenty-year-old skater made six triple jumps look effortless enough to earn her a perfect 6.0 in artistic impression and went on to win the World Figure Skating Championships.

Kristi kept up a relentless training schedule during her last two years of high school, in Fremont, California. She woke up at 4:00 every morning and ate a bowl of cereal while her mother drove her to the rink for a five-hour practice; then she changed clothes in the car on the way to her afternoon classes. She did the course work for her morning classes at home before her 8:00 PM bedtime.

Kristi says it isn't always easy to put in the hours at the rink, but it's worth it. "There are some days when everything's going well, and you feel like you could skate forever and not make a mistake. Then you just don't want to stop."



Duncan Kennedy's career began at the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, New York. When an announcer who'd brought his luge couldn't fit it in his hotel room, Duncan's mom let him store it at her log cabin. "I'd come home at night and find Duncan lying on the sled in the luge position watching the Olympics on TV," she says. Soon afterward he attended a luge camp, and the next year he became Junior North American Champion.

Duncan's career almost ended that summer when he was diagnosed with what doctors thought was a brain tumor. Even then, all he could think about was sliding. So his mother took him to Europe to see the champions compete. He now calls the trip "the best training I ever got." Today, at twenty-four, Duncan is healthy and eager to return. "I think I can do really well," he says, "and that's half the battle."

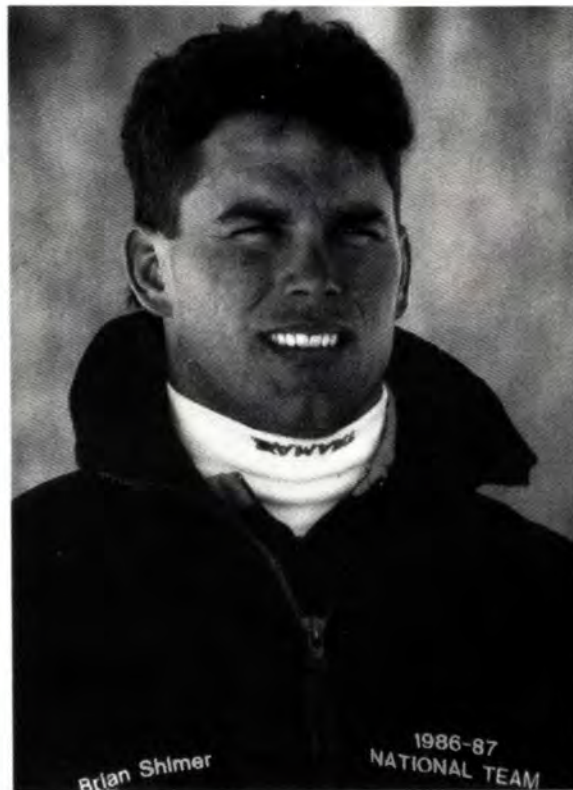

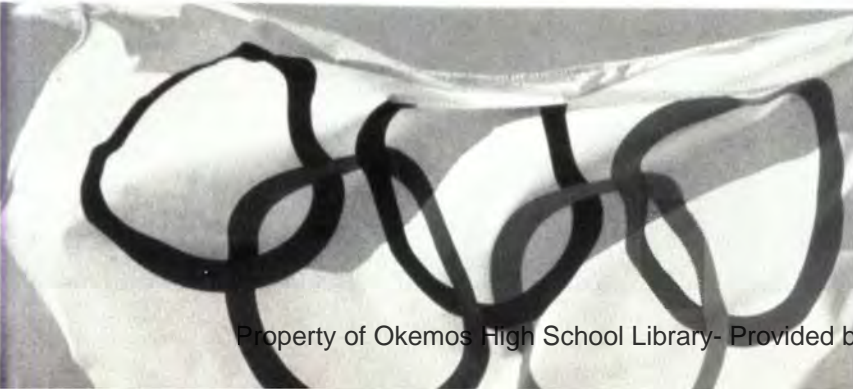


Brian Shimer, bobsled

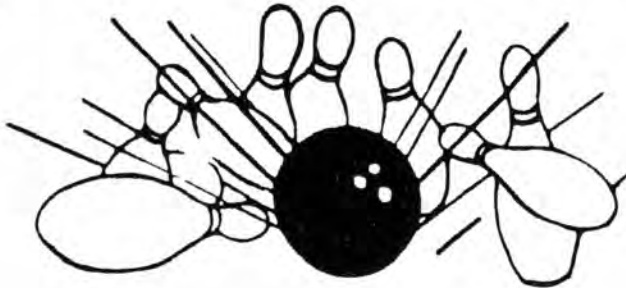

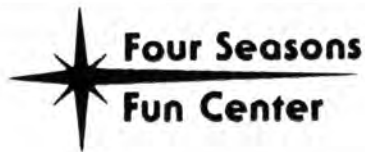
