Library Offers “Food for Fines” April 10-16

Lansing, MI – To celebrate National Library Week, the Capital Area District Library is offering Food for Fines, a week-long program that allows patrons to donate packaged food and other items to get up to \$5 in overdue fines waived from their library accounts.

All branches of the Capital Area District Library will take donations of non-perishable food during National Library Week, April 10-16, 2011. For every food item donated, one dollar in overdue fines will be waived, up to a maximum of \$5 per patron. We can apply the waived amounts only to overdue fines – they cannot be applied to lost/damaged items, a non-resident fee, or any other kind of charge. Visit www.cadl.org/food for more information.

Special Considerations:

- We cannot provide credit for future overdue fines.
- Items may be donated in person at any branch of the Capital Area District Library during open hours. Do not leave donated items in the return box or outside the library door.
- We can accept food items and personal care items.
- All items must be in unopened, undamaged packaging and within the expiration date.
- We cannot accept cash or checks on behalf of the food banks. We can only accept food or personal care items. To have a fine waived, an item must be donated.
