RAINBOWS BACKPACK ACTIVITIES

Scrap Paper Rainbow Craft

Use a paper grocery bag to draw the outline of Let's wave our scarves high! your rainbow. Look around the house for scraps of paper for each color. Or, instead of paper, you could use yarn, buttons, fabric, stickers or other craft supplies to create your rainbow! Let's wave our scarves slow!

A Rainbow Fair

When the rain falls from the sky, (sprinkle fingers down) Don't forget to look up high. (look up) If the sun is shining there, (make circle w/arms above head) You may see a rainbow fair: (make rainbow shape with hands) Red, orange, yellow, green, and blue, (show color ribbon, or count on fingers) And you'll see there's purple too.

Rainbow Colors

Rainbow Purple, rainbow blue, Rainbow green and yellow too. Rainbow orange, rainbow red, Rainbow smiling overhead. Come and count the colors with me, How many colors can you see? One, two, three, up to green, Four, five, six colors can be seen.

Let's Make a Rainbow!

Let's wave our scarves high! Let's wave our scarves low! Let's wave our scarves fast! Let's wave our scarves slow! Now let's crumple up our scarves. One, Two, Three! (Throw scarves into the air and watch the rainbow of colors fall to the ground.)
