This year was unlike any other for many different reasons. First and probably the most important would be moving into the new school. Just being in it is a great experience


for many to share. Whether it was a sporting event, a class, or club, it just goes to show that Williamston High School is just no ordinary place.





The move was not a problem at all. Students emp-






Unlike Any Other Week At WHS...

HOMECOMING


















Hornets Finish 2nd In ICL




Building Year






