
Students Study Abroad

Senior, Sara Harrison spent her senior year as a Youth For Understanding exchange student. She lived in La Serena, Chile, with a Chilean host family and studied at the Colegio Ingles Catolico. Her main reason for embarking on this experience was to become bilingual in Spanish. This was accomplished, but Sara found that learning the language was only a small part of the value of her experience. In addition to gaining a new respect for people of different cultures and races, she developed maturity, self-confidence, and a better understanding of her own country. She describes her year in Chile as "the greatest, most rewarding experience of my life."

Senior, Katie Flore spent 3 weeks of her senior year breathing, thinking, studying, and sleeping immersed in Italian culture. During this project she was able to study music and take lessons with a flute professor at the music conservatory i Udine. This experience was also aimed at observing classes at a branch of the John Hopkins University in Bologna. Along with learning more about international business and music, Katie was able to travel throughout northern Italy and the Tuscan region. This unique opportunity was not only intellectually enriching but also broadened her mind to new and different cultures.




Call It Determination




The Band Plays On





Co-captain Aimée Mouser... "One word to sum up the season is strategy, strategy, strategy. Seriously, it was a really fun season."





Grapplers Send One To States




