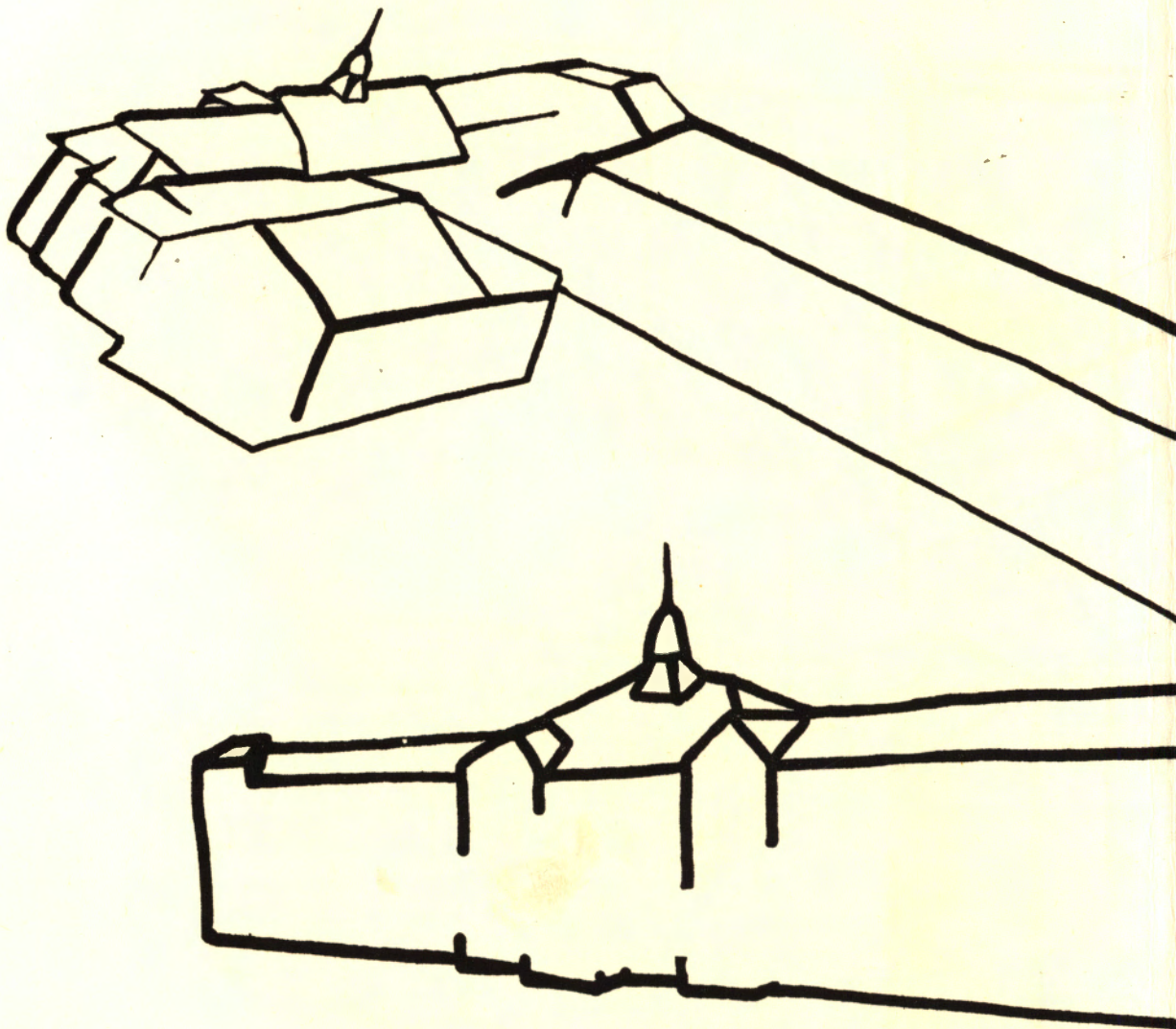


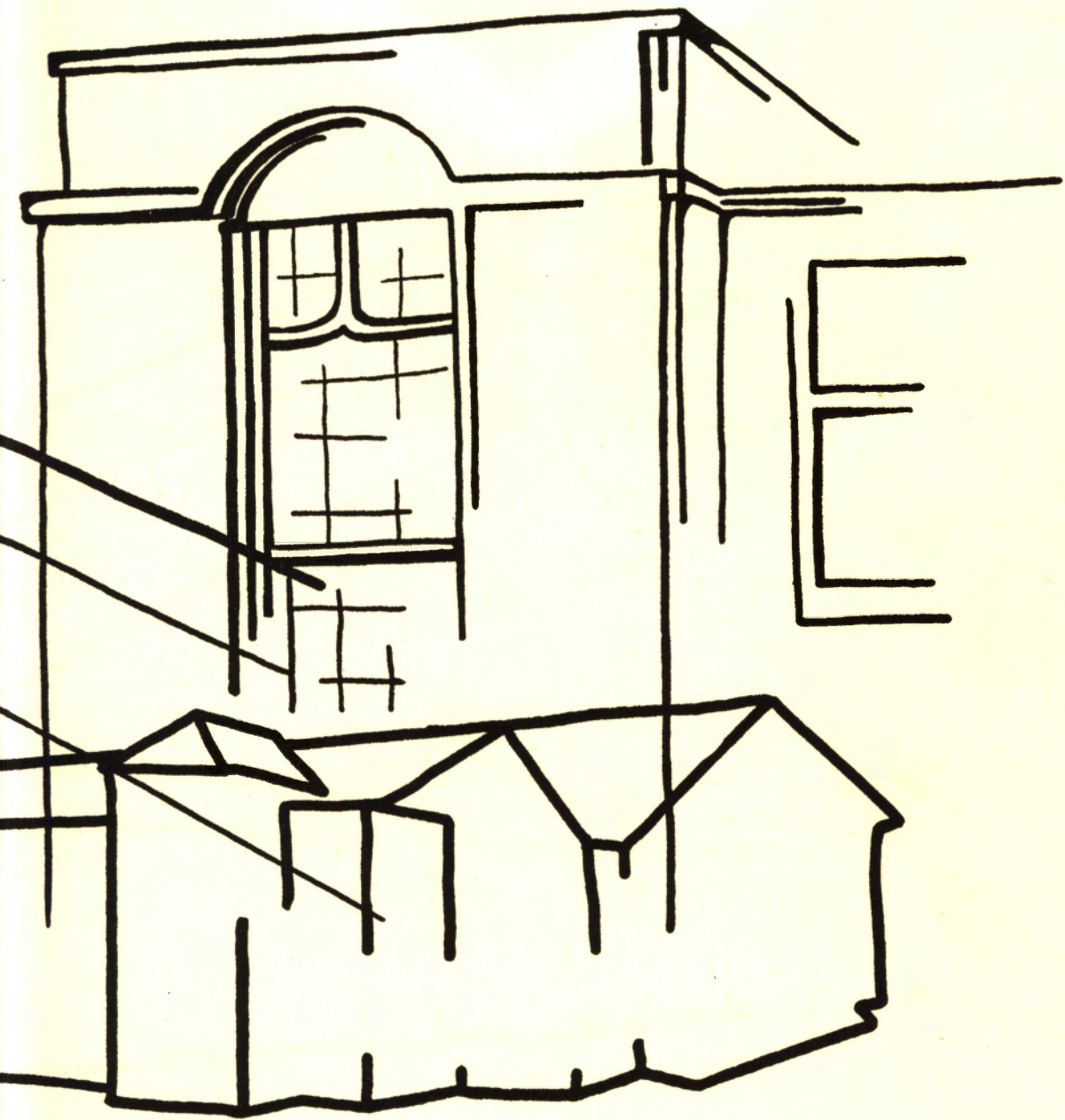

The gavel from our clubs, the open school book, and the guiding hand of our teachers are permanent reminders of our past and a glimpse into our future.



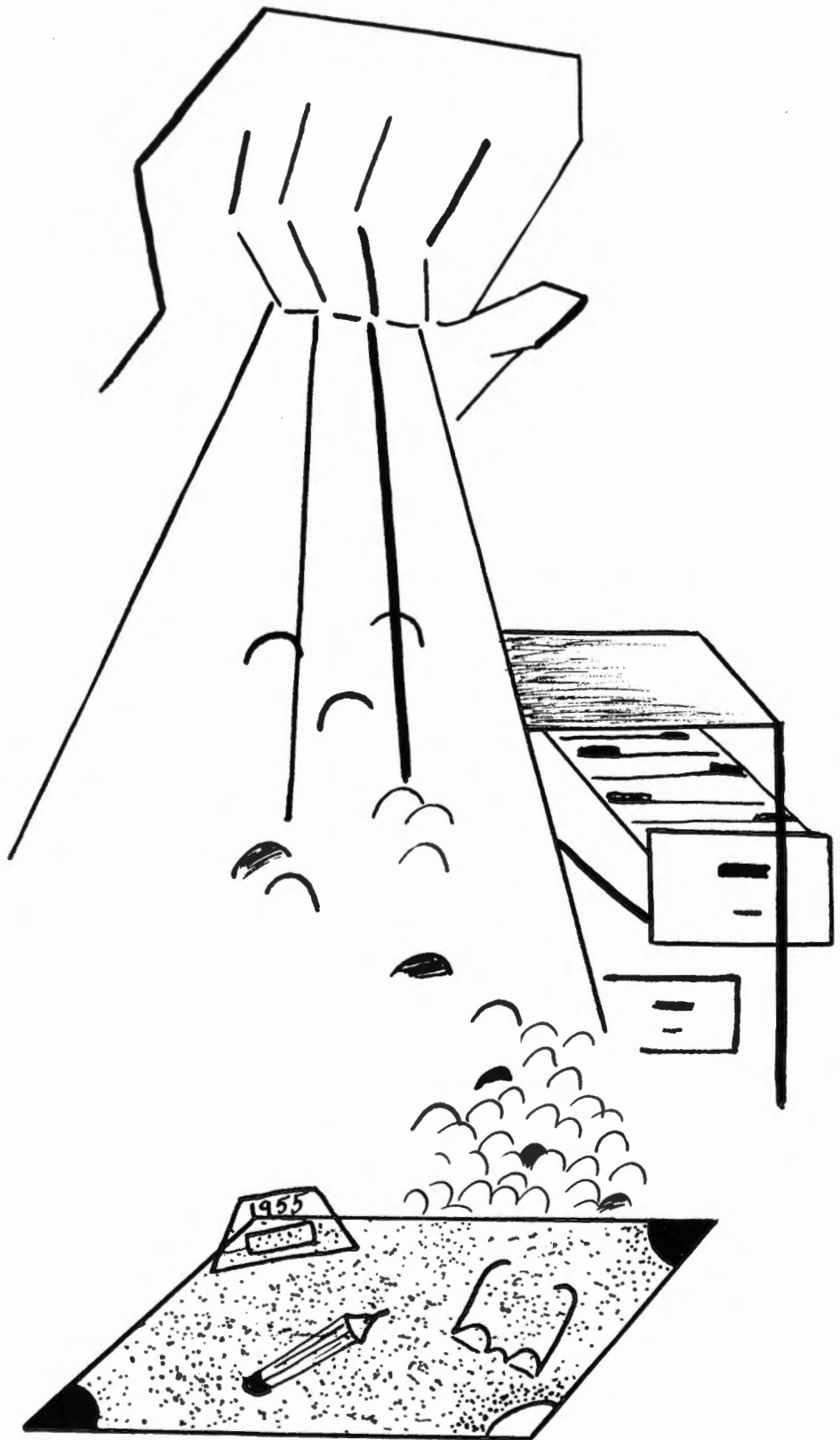

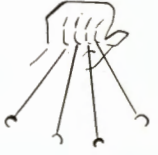
Student Council

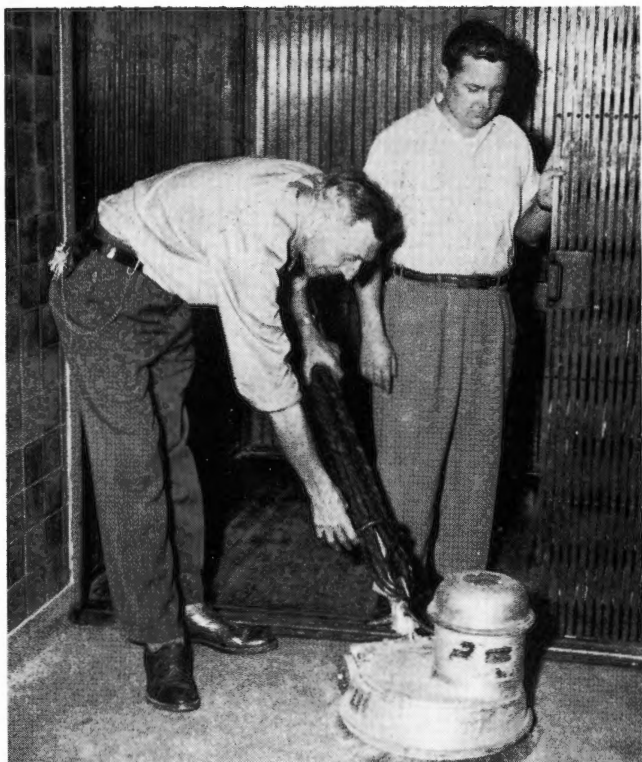

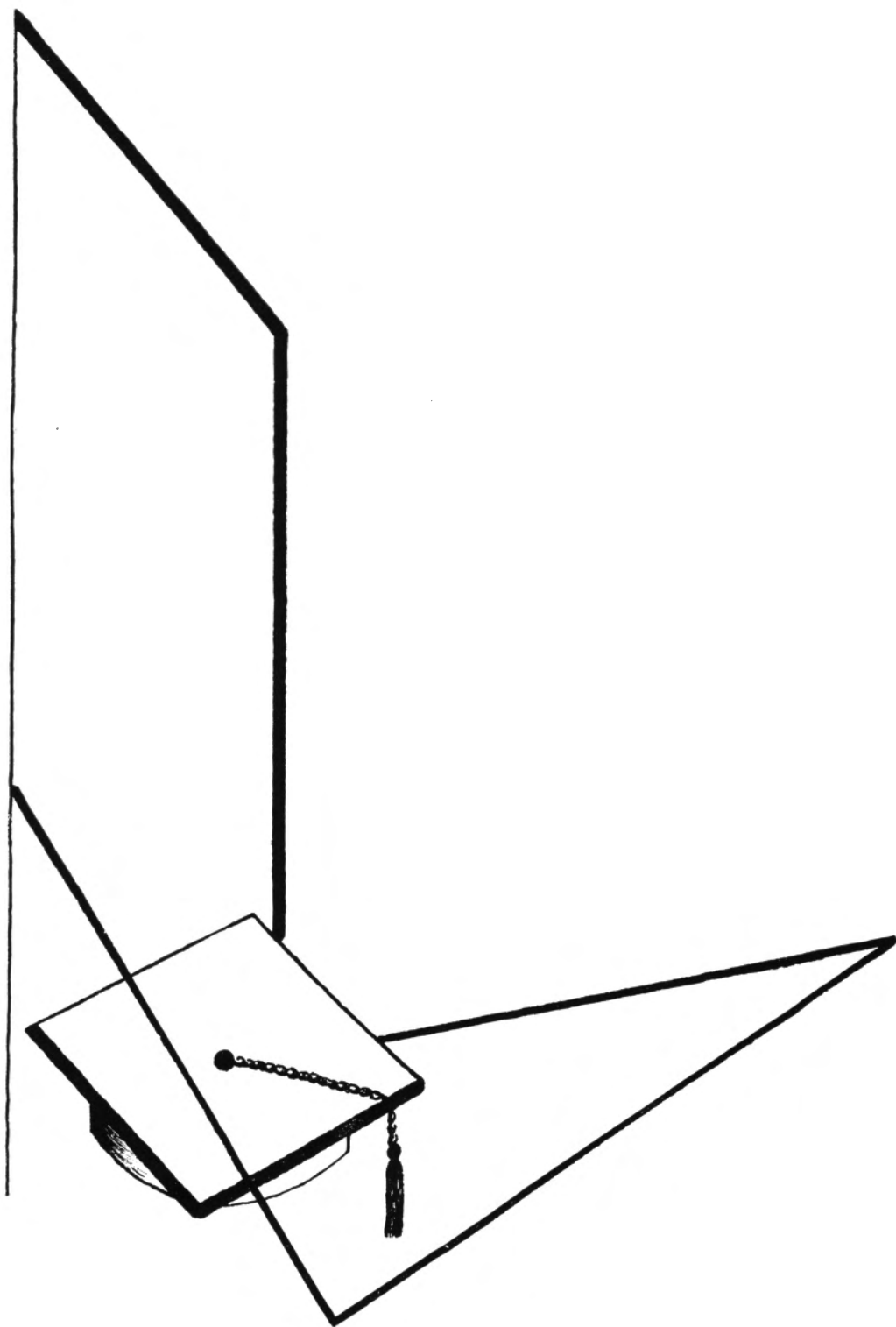

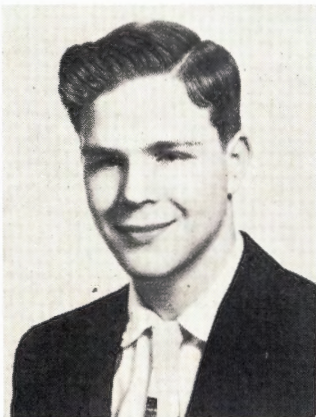


Maintenance and Office Help



Among the countless duties of the office girls is filing. Eastern's two secretaries, Sue Middlebrook and Virginia Christofferson, very capably perform their important tasks.





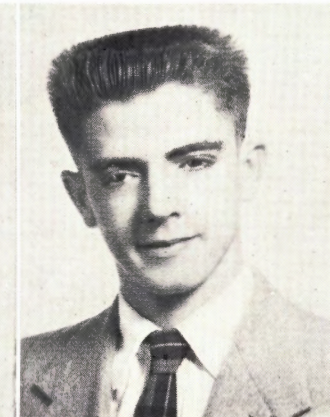

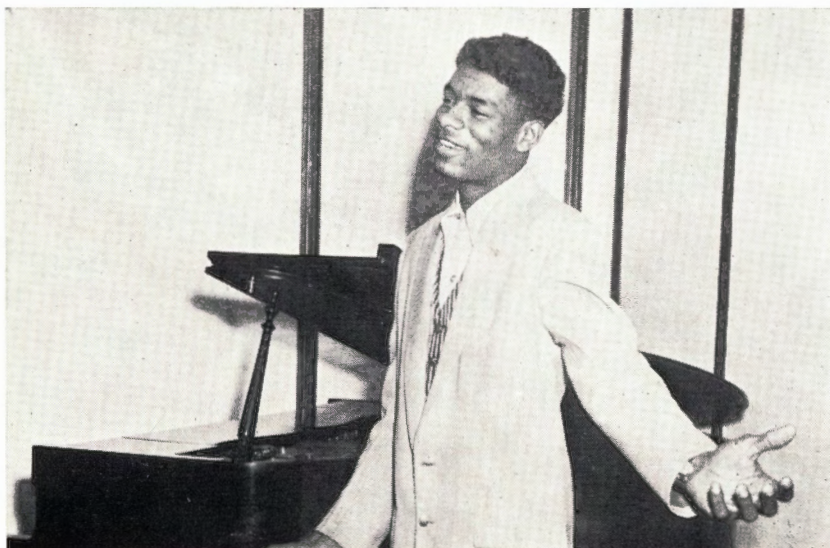


Eastern's Top Talent

Levi's favorite vocalists are Nat "King" Cole and Peggy Lee. He is president of Eastern's Music Appreciation Club.



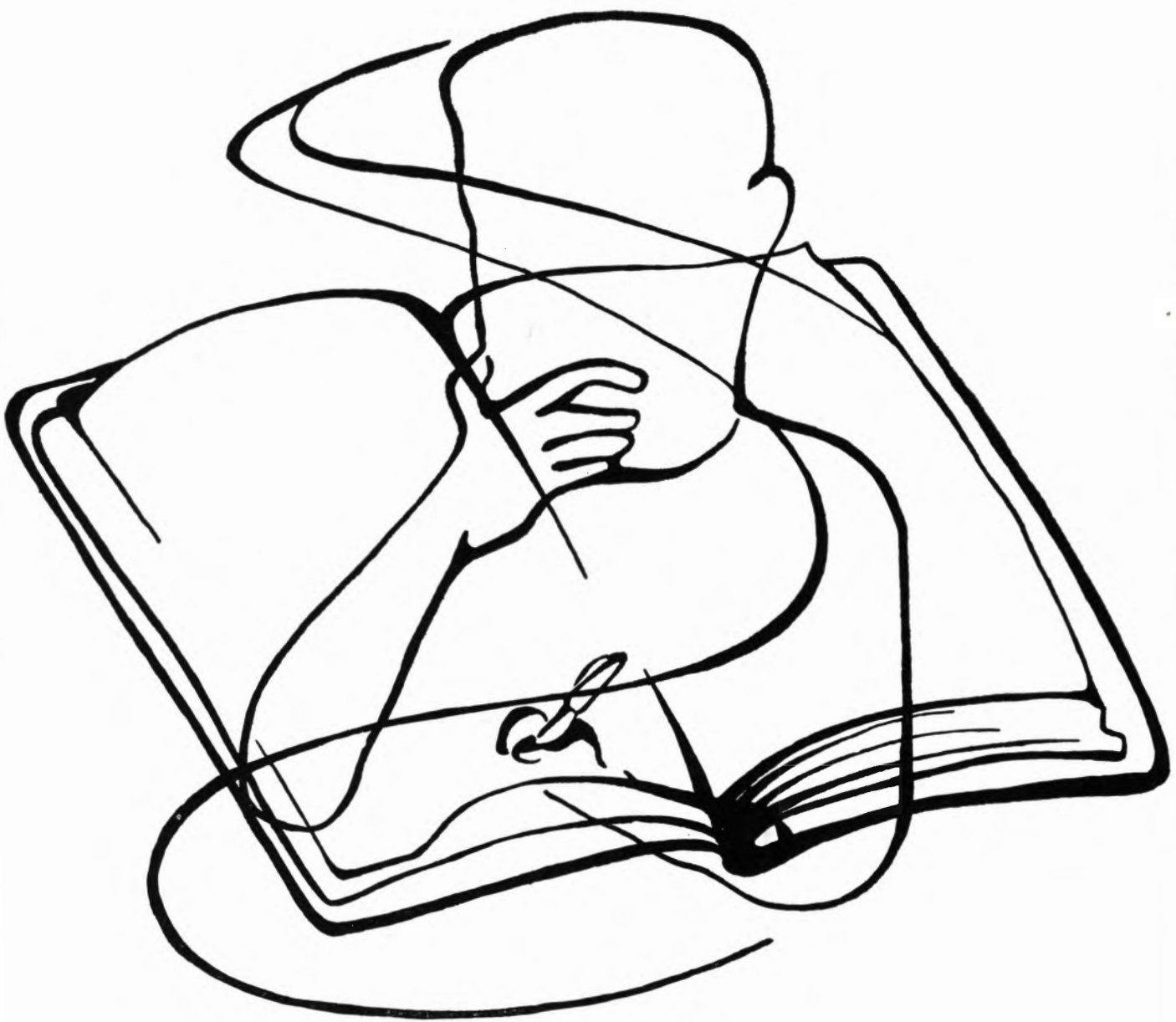
Our Adopted Orphan

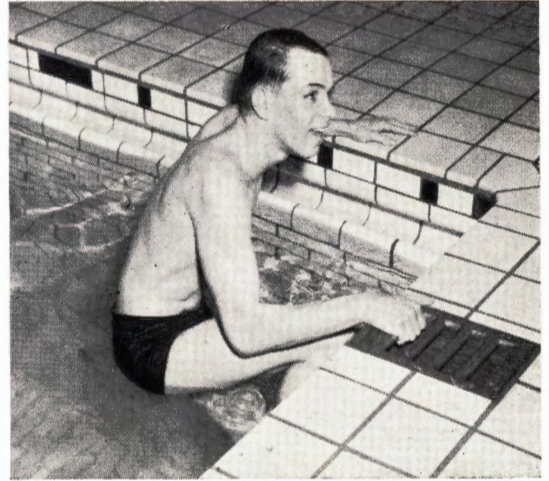

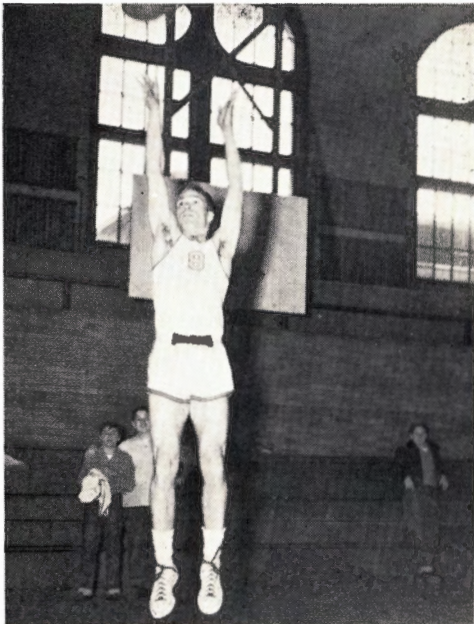

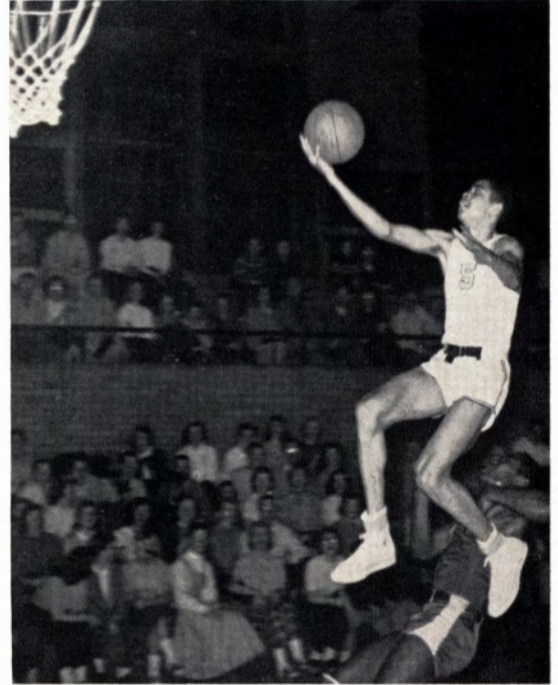

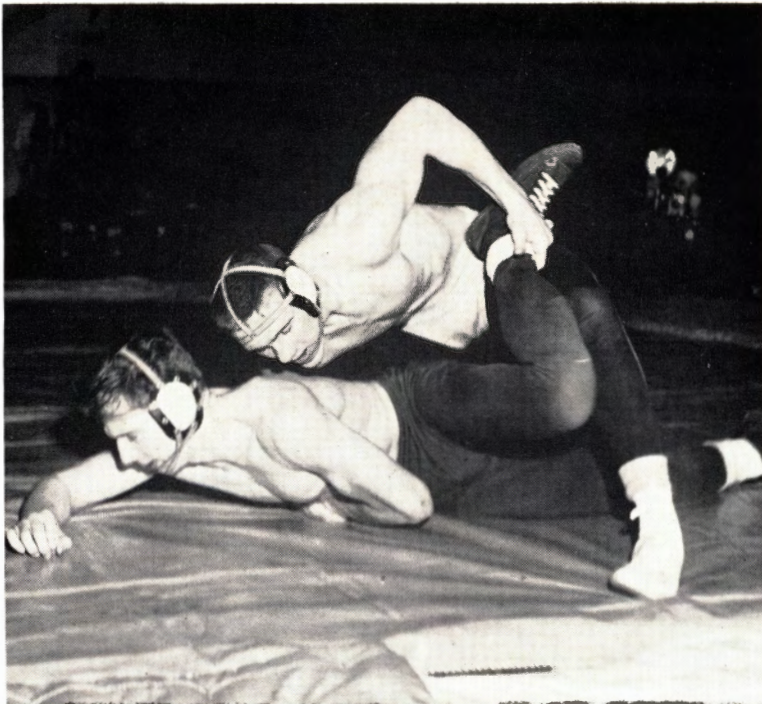

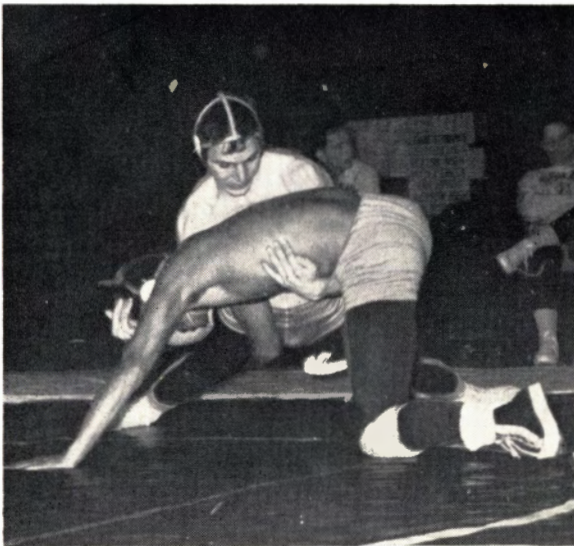

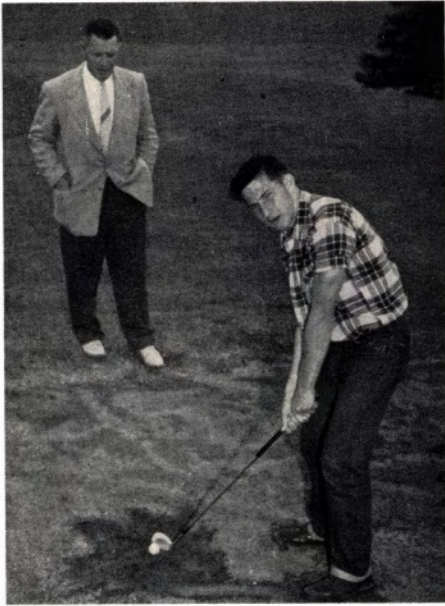
