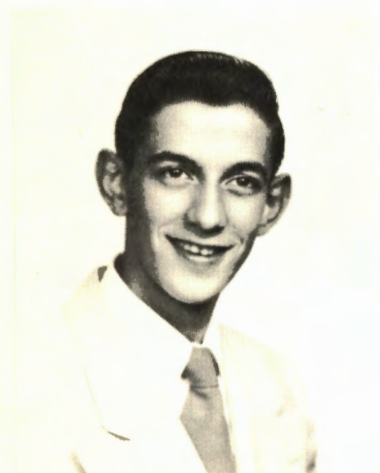

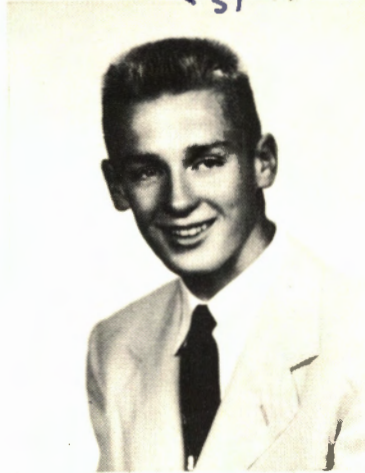

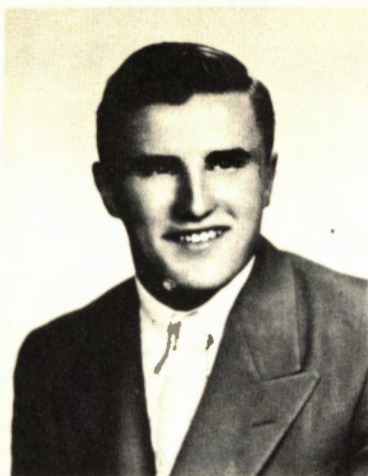

About two weeks later, Mr. Smith, class advisor, conducted our first class meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to elect officers to lead the class.

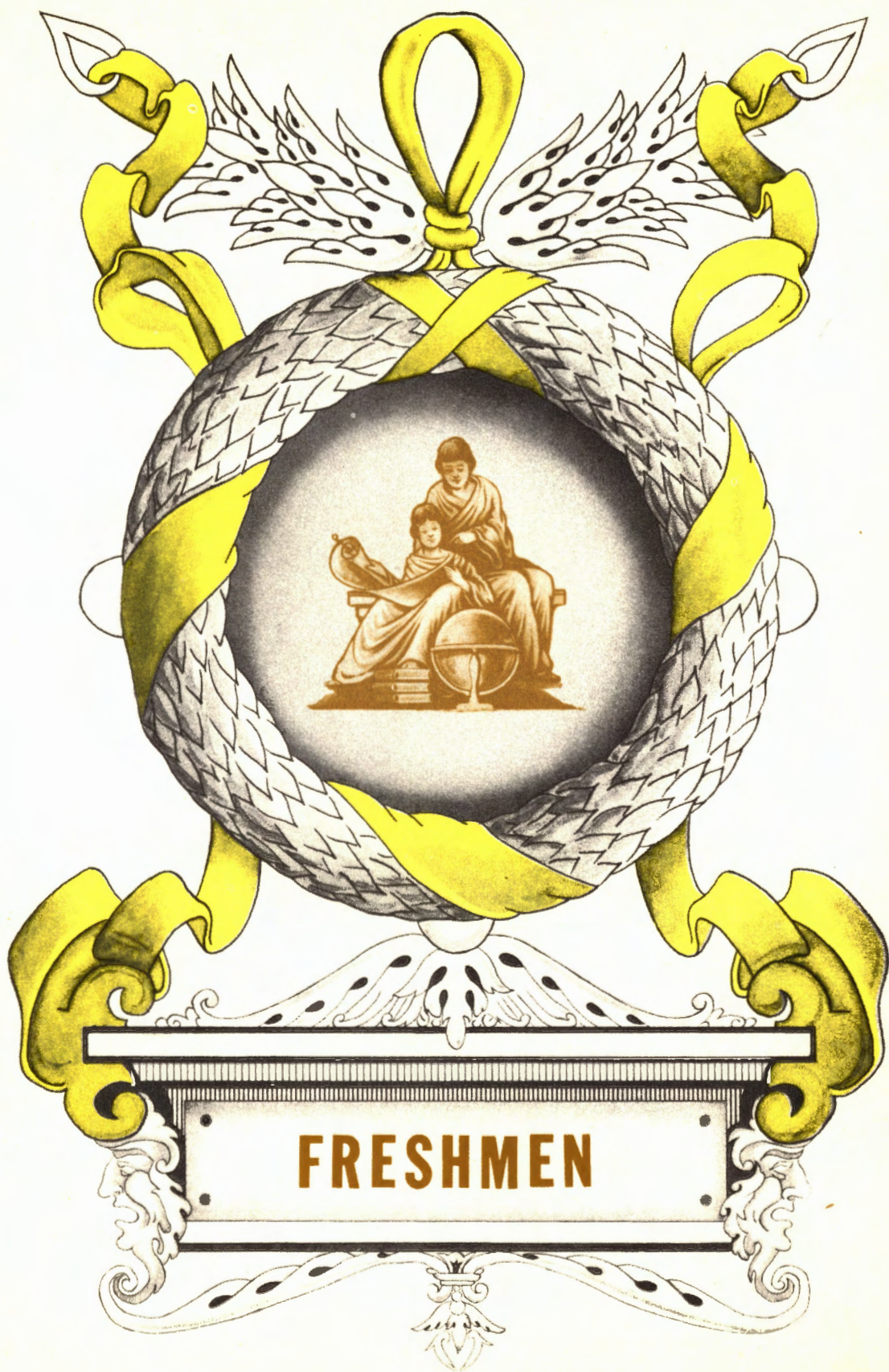

As chairman of the Constitution Committee Shirley Shepard reported that the new constitution which the committee drafted was ratified by the school.

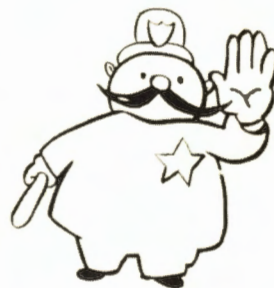
With help from the Athletic Ass. the S. C. served refreshments to all the basketball teams which played in our gym.
