She has seen a great number of students come and go, and many changes take place at our Alma Mater.



## THE MAIN SCHOOL BUILDING

September 1918 was my first introduction to Holt School.

Since that time it has been my pleasure to see our school system, through the excellent co-operation of a group of public spirited citizens, grow from a three room building to the present forty-four class-rooms in five buildings.

The enrollment was ninety-nine, the largest in the school's history at the time, for grades one through eight. The 1951-'52 enrollment for all grades was about 1065.

Three members comprised the faculty as compared to the equivalent of about forty-six full time faculty members in 1951-'52.

In that year stress was put only on the 3 R's. Since then athletics, music, art, shop and home economics have been added to the curriculum.

Teaching methods have changed over the years, with more attention now being given to each child's needs in addition to reasonable stress on subject matter.

The high school has been placed on the University of Michigan's accrediatation list, since I came here. Also, the Student Teacher and Child Growth and Development Programs have been instituted, with many benefits resulting for the children and the school.



Holt opened a very successful gridiron season when they played Leslie under the lights and won 34-0. After downing Williamston 25-6, Holt and Dansville clashed in a furiously fought game which turned out to be the biggest upset in the Ingham County League, Dansville winning 6-0.


The next week Jim VerPlanck and Dick Cornwell each picked up a Stockbridge fumble and scampered for T.D.s to help Holt win 27-2.

In an afternoon game with the Okemos Chiefs, Holt tucked another win under its belt. We made this week around Holt "Hovanesian Week", as our assistant coach lived in and graduated from Okemos.

The following games were known to the team as the "Big Four". It meant either a championship or a failure. Mason, top team in the Capitol Circuit League, proved too strong for Holt, and we lost 13-6. The second of the "Big Four" series had a happier ending, however, and Holt won from a hard fighting Fowlerville team 20-7.

Everett, rated high in the state, came out on the bottom of 7-6 score.

The spirit shown by the student body in moving yards of snow to make possible the Haslett game was evidence enough for team members that they had 100 per cent backing. To show their appreciation, the Rams smeared the Vikings 25-0. This was the last high school game for 14 Holt Seniors.

For Holt's fast-breaking cagers, it was a banner season. The Rams, displaying the finest team balance in school history, raced to an enviable 14-1 record in regular play. Their only loss was a 38-34 decision to Haslett in the second game of the 1951-52 schedule. After that, Coach Ted Bauer's boys copped 13 straight to walk off with the league title.

In doing so, they poured in a total of 953 points, an average of more than 63 tallies each game, while the opposition was netting but 614, a little over 40 per contest. Although the squad hit astronomical figures in the Leslie game (81-44) and avenged the earlier Haslett loss with a 58-37 spanking, the year's sweetest victory was a 76-65 shellacing administered to Mason's co-champions of the Class B Capitol Circuit league.

The story of success was the story of team balance. Although Bud Beurman, one of the smoothestworking pivotmen in league history, paced the team in scoring, he was closely followed by forwards Bob Spraker and co-captain, Bud Miller. Meanwhile, guards Dick Fluke and co-captain Hugh Smyth provided the galloping Rams with the necessary play-making combination. It was a great year..... and a great team.










