It was the year of the Ram.

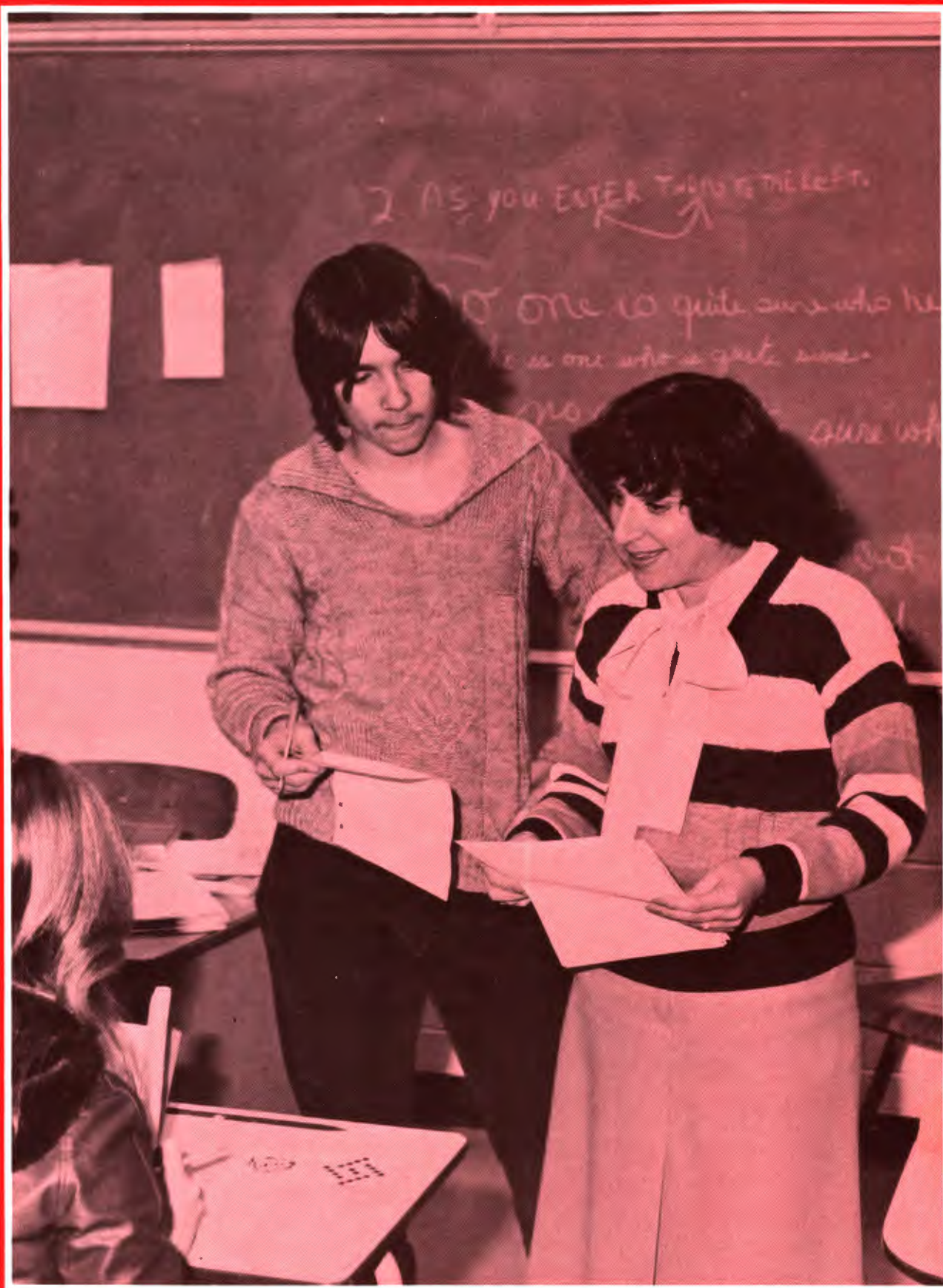
Dedicated to... Mrs. Judy Frank

The Rampages staff proudly dedicates this 1979 edition to Mrs. Judy Frank, a teacher who is loyal, active and dedicated.

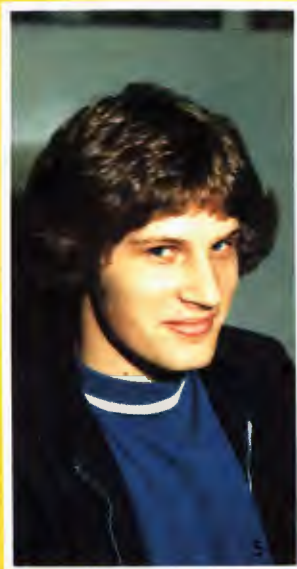

The boys' golf team and the wrestling team ended their seasons with a state runner-up championship trophy, while girls' and boys' swimming, boys' cross country, football and girls' track finished their seasons in the top ten against the toughest Class B competition in the state. The dedicated coaches taught their players how to accept losses, how to win, but most of all, how to be good sports.

Eleven earn All-Metro recognition

Powerhouse Rams CAC, quarterfinal champions

The 1978 football season marked Holt's resurgence as a powerhouse gridiron squad when the Rams won the CAC championship and went on to state competition for the first time in their history.

All-Metro coach of the year Dennis Bongard attributed his team's success to the maturity of its 13 senior lettermen, seven of whom earned All-Metro recognition. Four juniors were also mentioned on the All-Metro squad.

Although the season ended with a disappointing semi-final loss to Warren Woods, Bongard felt that "being CAC champs and having our only loss come at the hands of the eventual state champions made it a tremendous season for all involved."

The tears flowed freely. Thirteen seniors had just played in their last high school football game, and the majority had played the last organized football game of their lives.

Why the tears, though? The Rams had played superbly all year, and they had a great season. Their list of accomplishments included a perfect 7-0 league record, in which all of their opponents were class B, an unblemished 9-0 regular season record, a ranking of third in the class B polls, a state quarter-final winner, and only one loss the whole year which came at the hands of the eventual state champion.

The pain of the loss was very real because the Rams simply did not play up to their potential in the final game. All the players realized that had they been on par, they would have played in the Pontiac Silverdome instead of Warren Woods. The Silverdome, where the sky is a white, air supported ceiling, the grass artificial and the temperature a comfortable 62, had been the goal and dream of the players all season. But the dream came to an abrupt halt one game short.

Sophomore Bill Stone's fourth place finish, combined with a strong team effort by coach Jerry Gillett's varsity harriers, rocketed this year's cross country team to a fifth place finish in the state meet behind defending champion Holly.

With a new course at Valhala Park, Stone posted a new record of 15:26, and later went on to run 15:11, the second best time ever by a Holt runner.

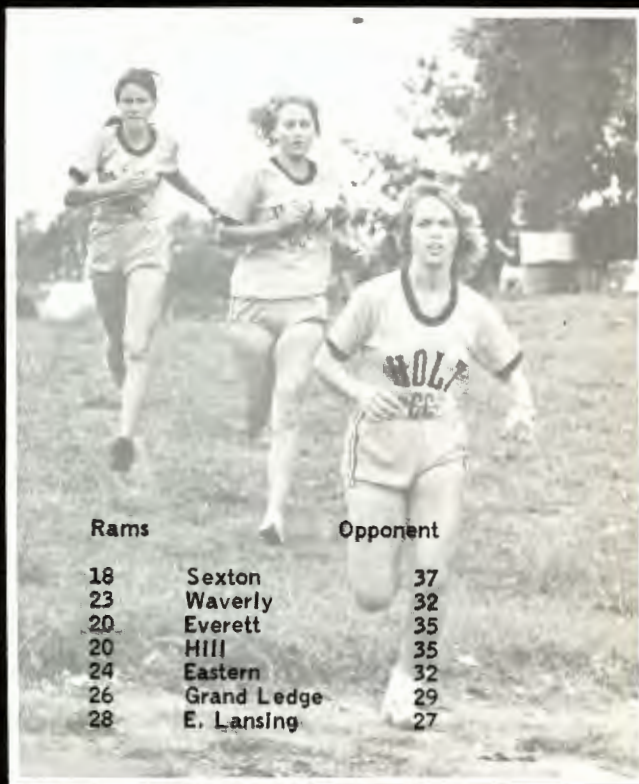
The team entered the regionals and finished fourth, placed third at the CAC meet, and second in the Mason Invitational.

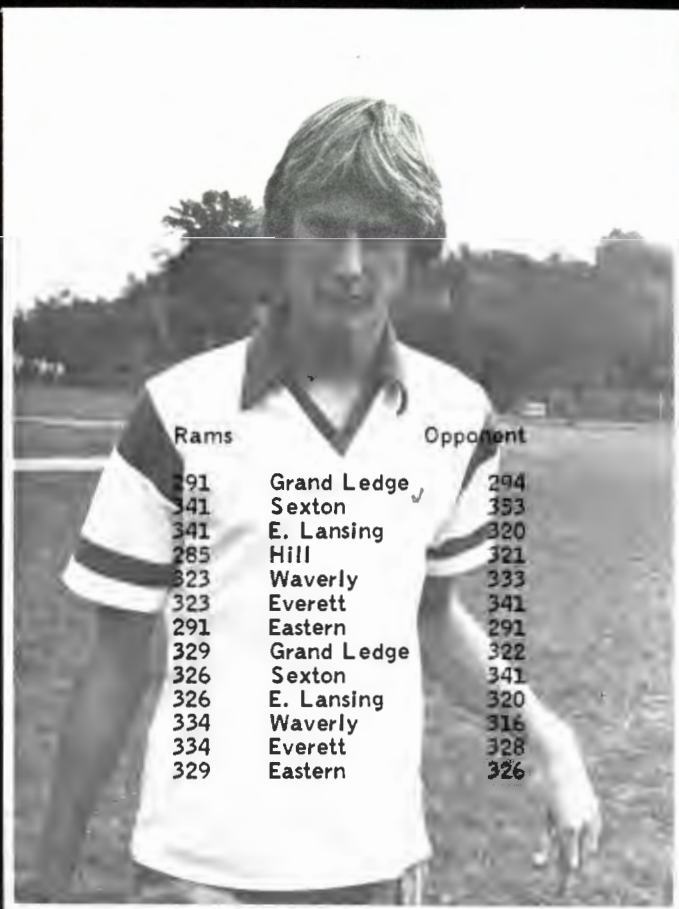
Golfers second in State

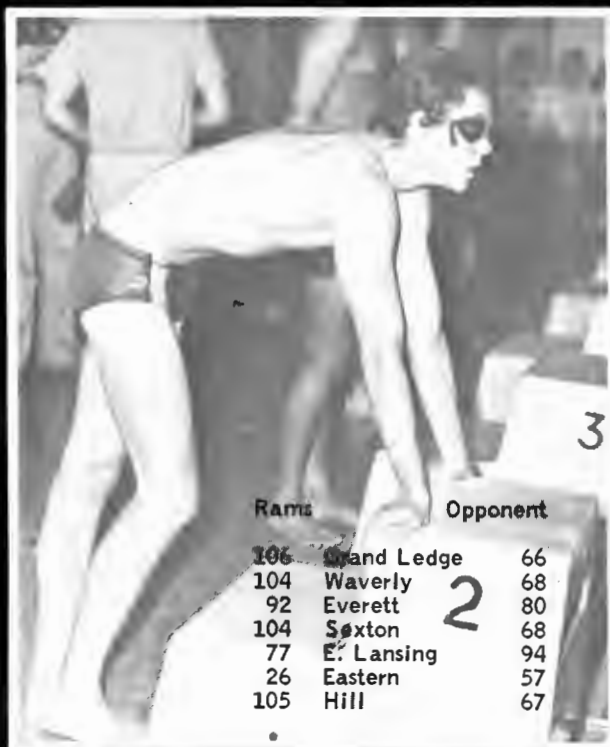

Tankers splash to third

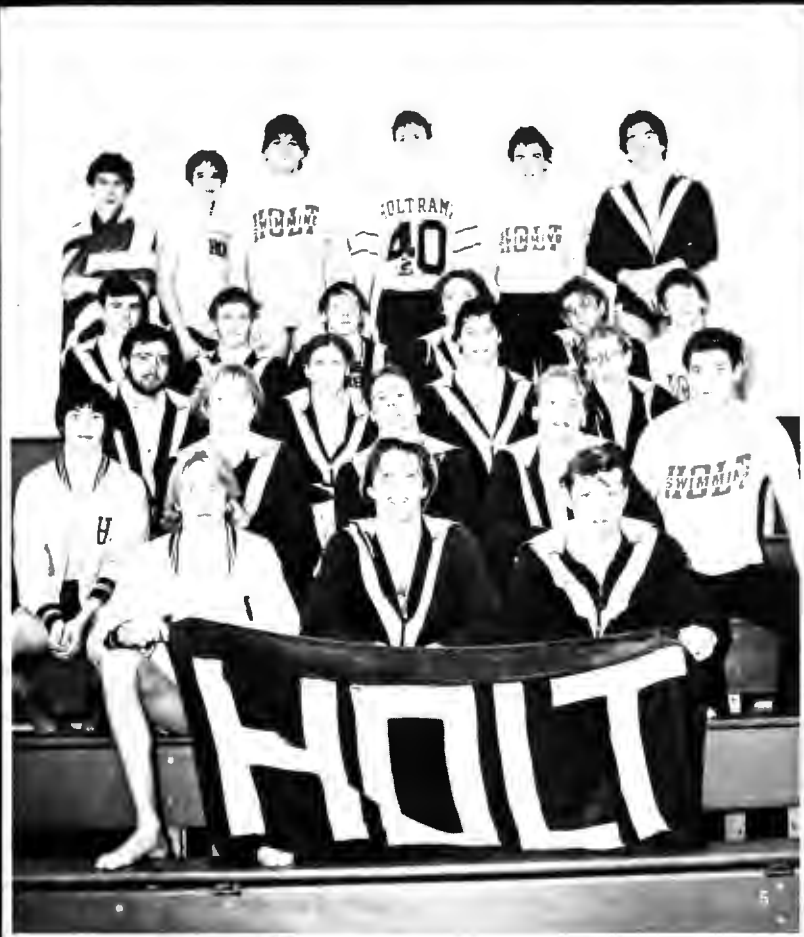

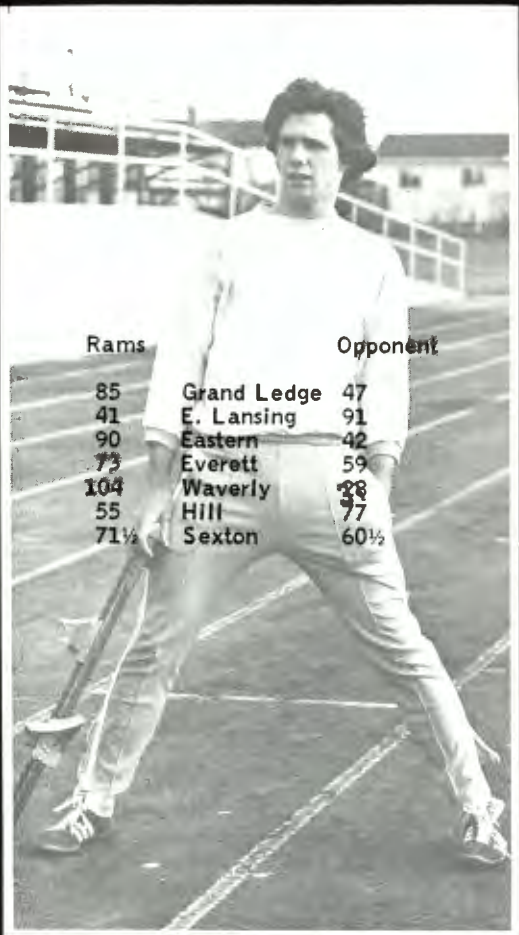
The squad sent seven individuals and one relay team into state competition at Grand Rapids where they finished in nineteenth place.

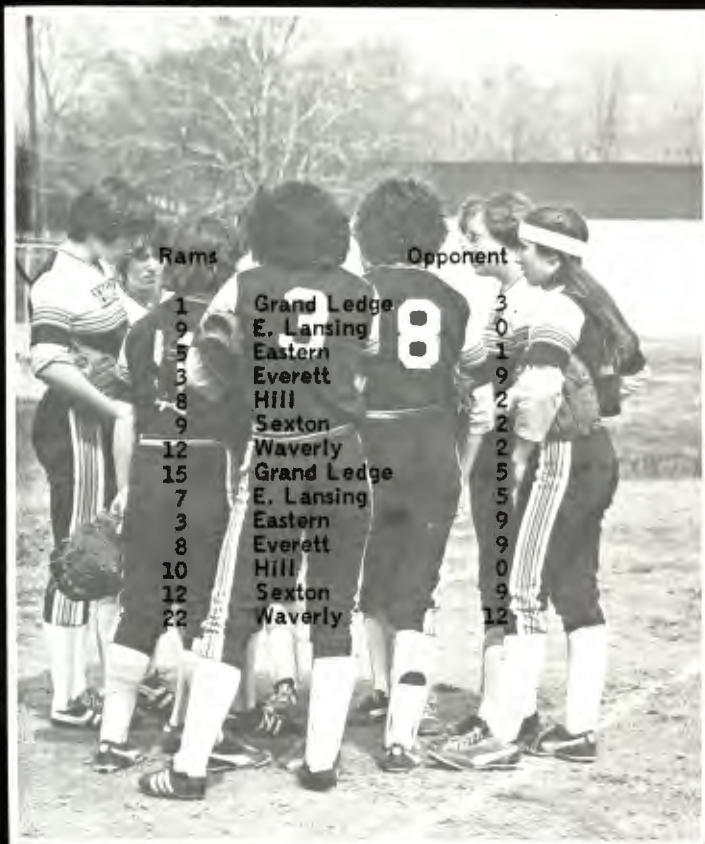
Howell leads hurlers

Girls' golf added to spring schedule

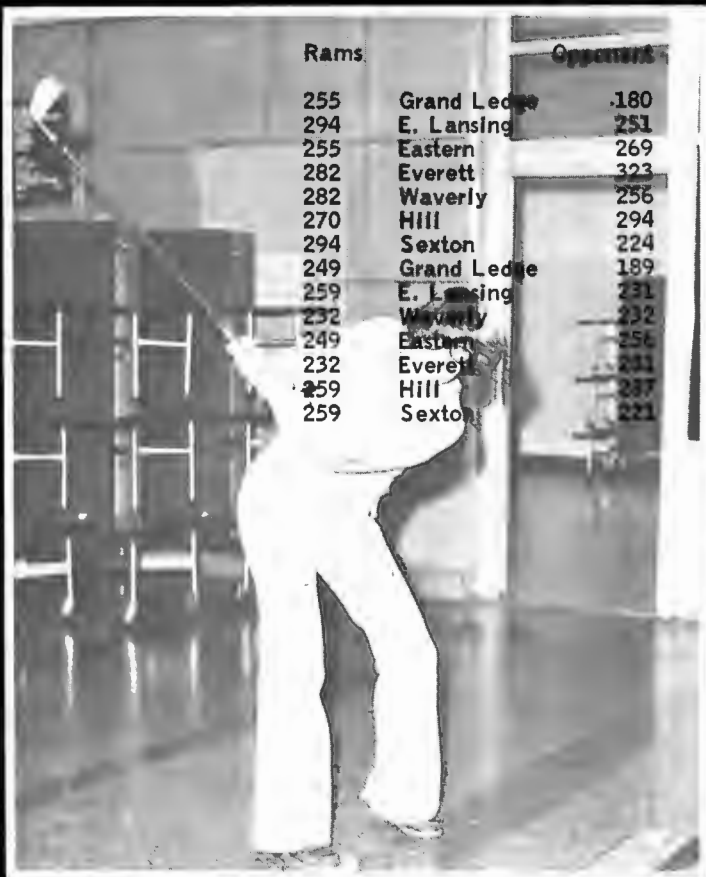
With the addition of girls' golf to the spring schedule, 15 girls, along with coach Scotty Shimnoski, spent many long hours learning the basics of golf.

The team got off to a slow start since only two girls had previous experience, but the squad did "accomplish everything we set out to do," according to Shimnoski.

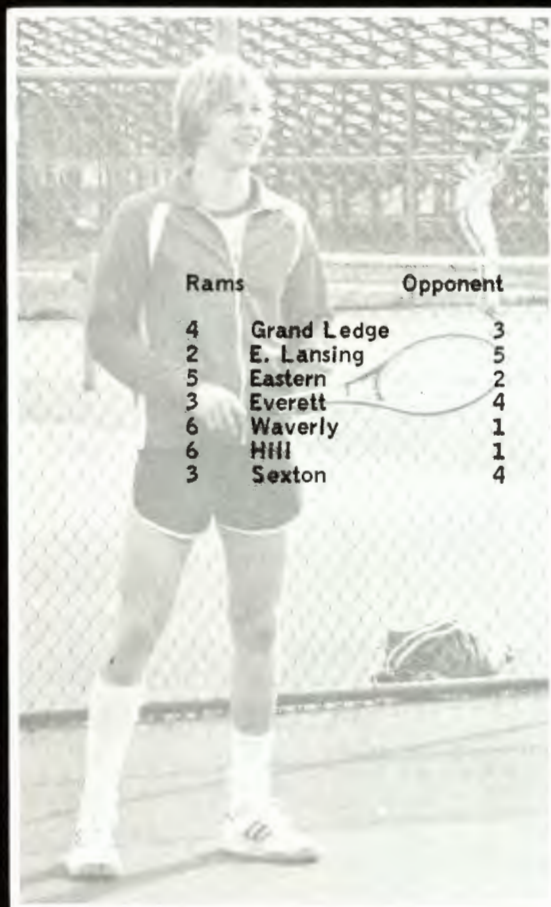

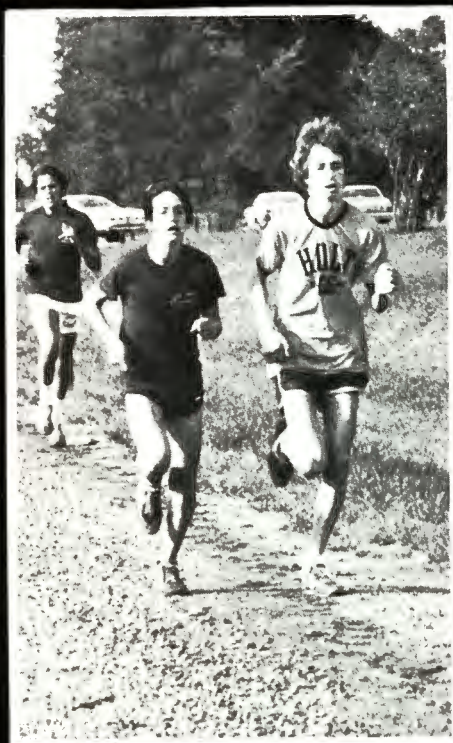


Strong JV harriers prepare for varsity

Rams fall one match short . . .

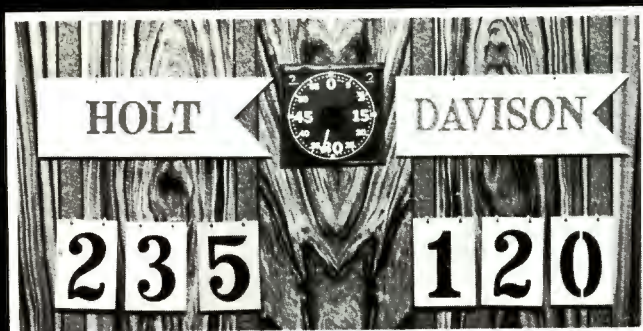
Overpowered by Grand Blanc

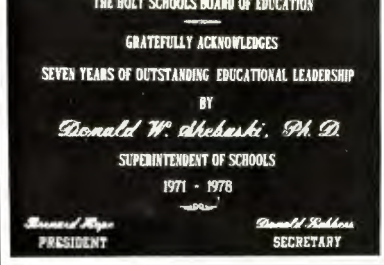

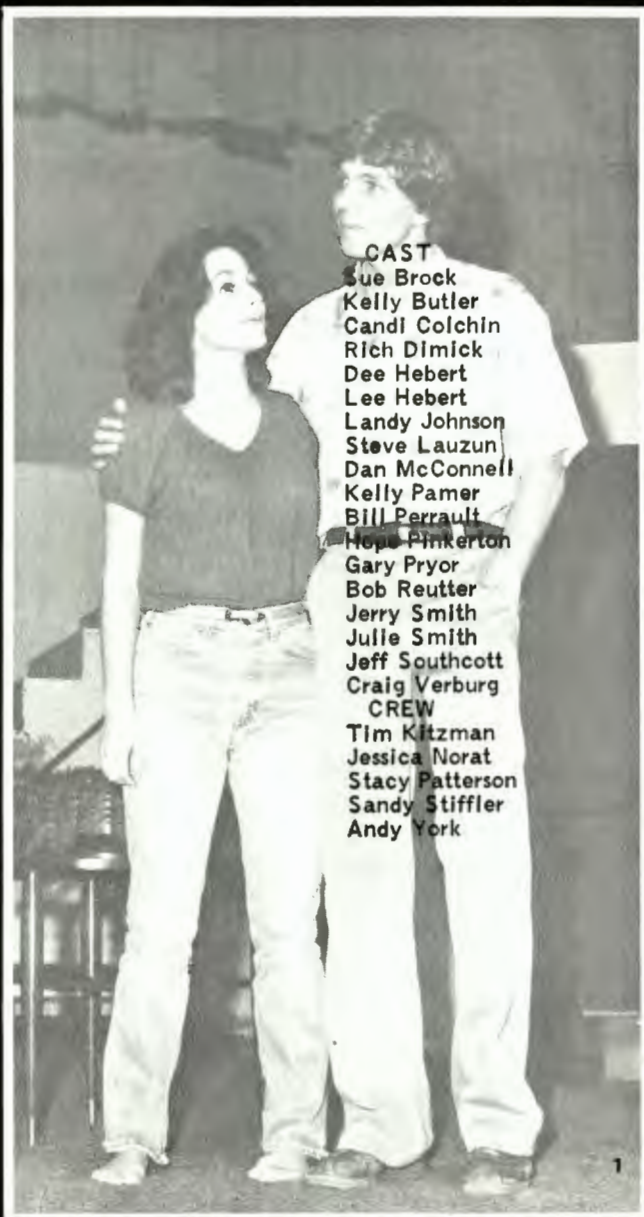
"Impossible Years" a hit
