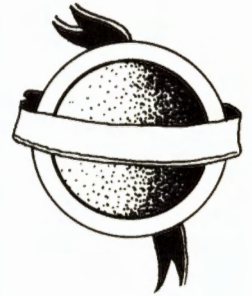

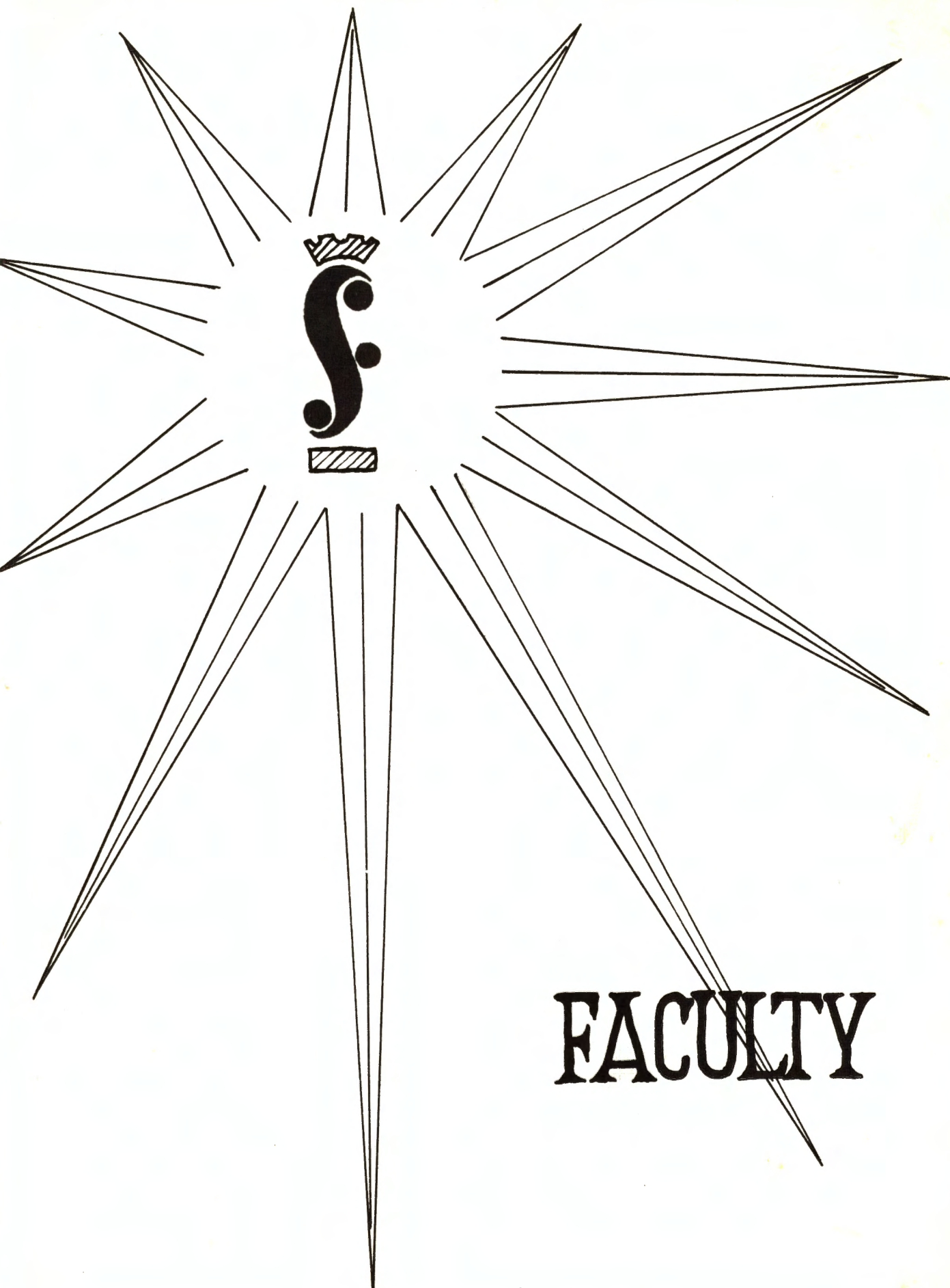

FACULTY



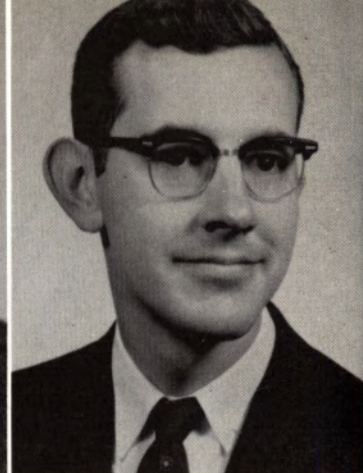

ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE

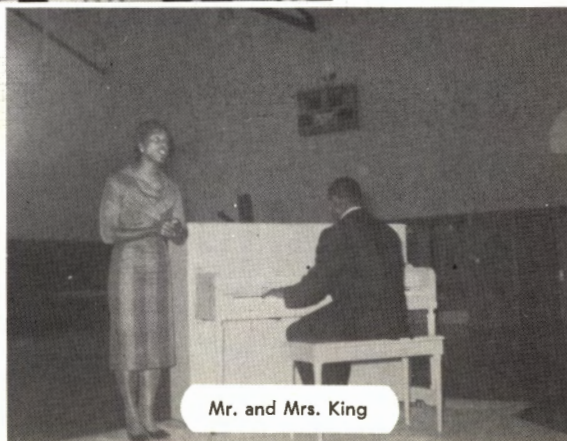

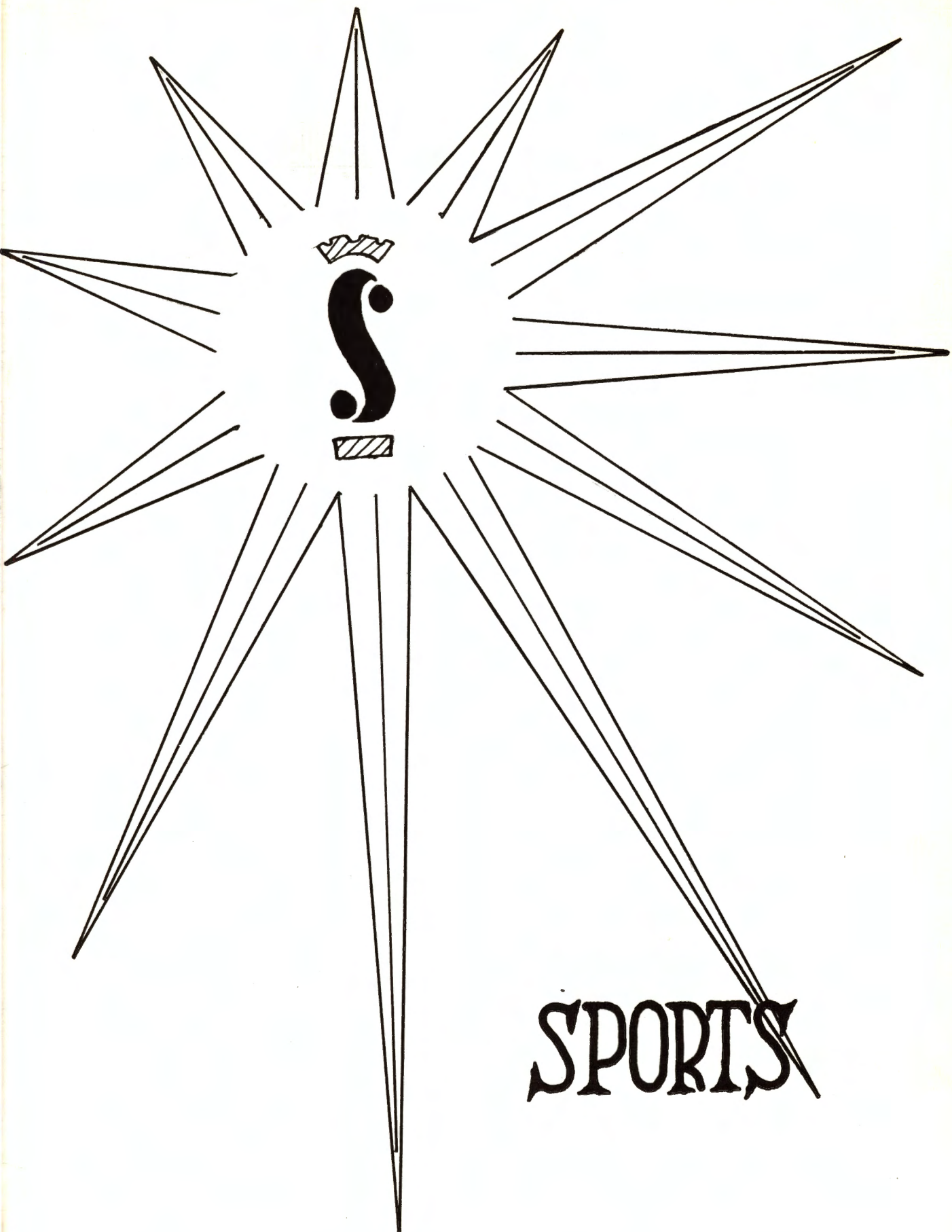
VARSITY CLUB

In the regional track meet at Ann Arbor High School, the Panthers finished in 7th place out of eleven teams participating.

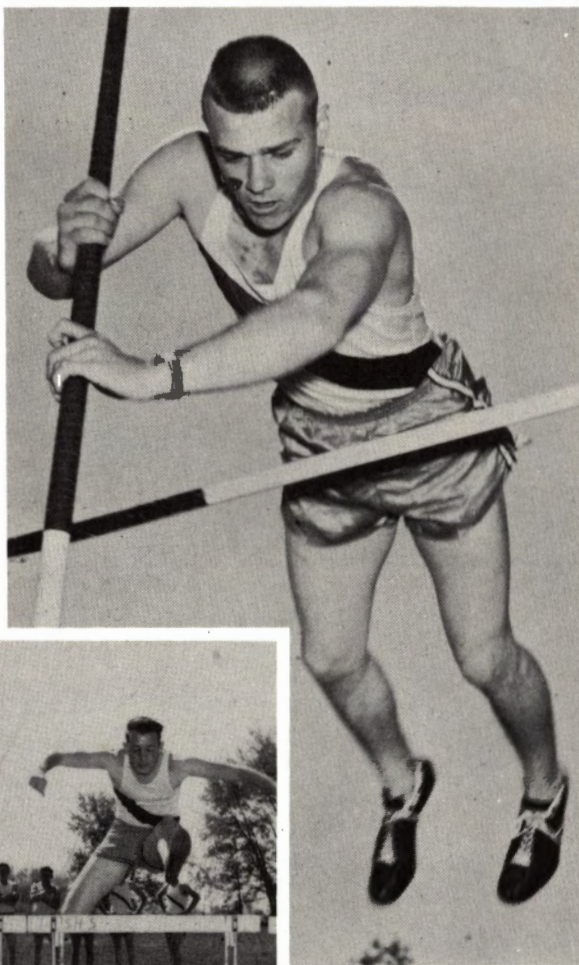
