Bill Rickman's 842 yards running earned him a spot on the Ingham County League Team, along with captains Dan Allen and Chuck Minix. Rich Hoard, Dave Showers, and Rick Potter recieved Honorable mention all league. The first field goal in recent years was also kicked by Doug Pena over a distance of 27 yards.



The Stockbridge Cross Country team got off to a fast start last fall, but fizzeled out near the end of the season.

With early season victories over Dansville and Perry, the Panthers were off to their best start in the history of the sport. Then top runner Paul Salow suffered a broken bone in his upper leg and was out for the remainder of the season. As a team, SHS fell from third place in the league to their final finish of sixth. Before existing, Salow managed to capture medals in the Perry and Springport Invitationals against some top talent in the state.

Salow and fellow junior Tom Eddington, who also earned medals at Perry and Springport, as well as, Haslett, Mason, and Manchester, were named co- "Most Valuable." Eddington qualified and ran in the State Class C Finals (for the second year in a row) at Sturgis, Michigan. Eddington also set a new school record of '5:37 on the SHS home course, breaking the old mark of 15:50.

Sophomore Alan Conway showed much promise for the future, running as the third best man on the team all season.


Senior Steve Wiley finished his cross country career with much improvement and provided the winning difference in several close meets.
