Early in the school year the Board of Education faced the problem of the defeated millage. Twice the millage was refused by the people of Stockbridge, Gregory, and Munith. The third millage election, held October 14, 1982, passed the renewal but turned down the additional two mills. This provided enough funds for the school to remain open but many programs were cut. Current World Events, Sociology, Lamb Lab, Journalism II, Drafting II, Speech, and General Business were programs cut from the High School's curriculum. Some classes increased their class loads because of teacher layoffs.



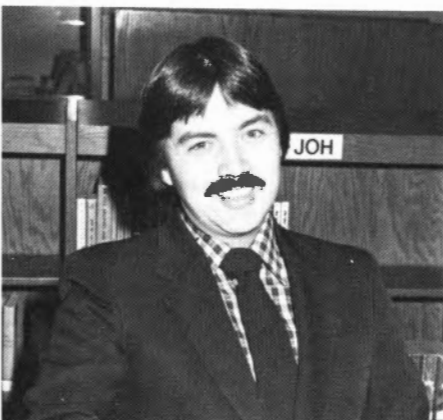

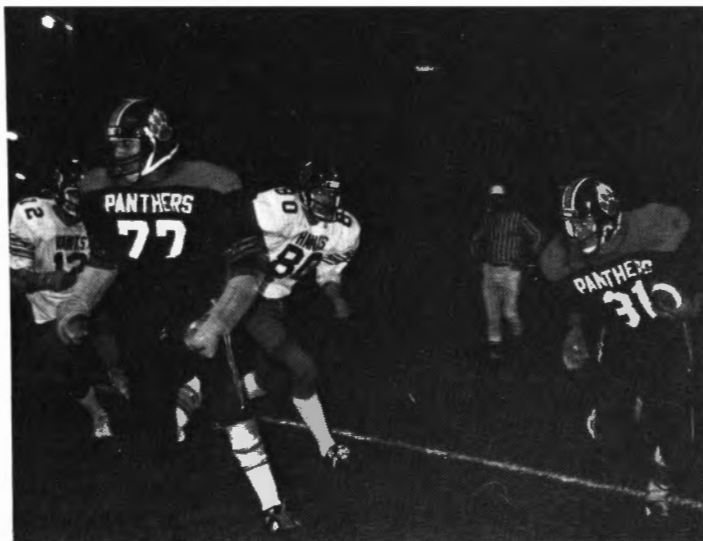

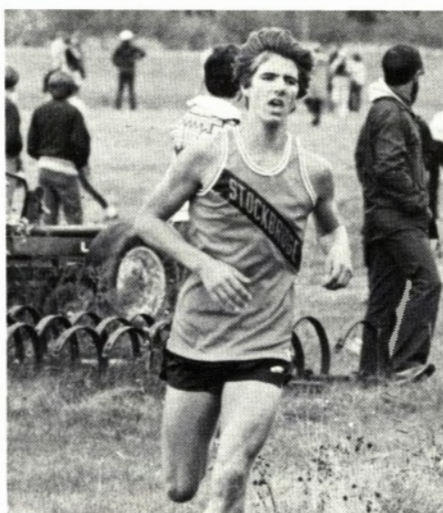

The highest honor that a high school student can receive is being elected to the National Honor Society—To be eligible a student must have a B/+ average or better. All faculty members vote on the eligible students they are acquainted with. The students are given a voting from 1 to 4 in each of three areas; Character, Leadership, and Service. The scores in each of these areas are averaged with the student's grade point. Only those students with an overall rating of 3.25 or better are elected to the Honor Society.

A student can become eligible for the Society at any time he has achieved the necessary grade point and has finished 3 semesters of high school. Once elected, a student must maintain the required grade point and continue to show the qualities of Character, Leadership, and Service that got him elected. If a student is ever dismissed from the Society, he may not be reelected at any future time.
